**VI. Open of Public Hearing:**

- I.* Commissioner Whitfield reviewed a request from Jeffery Paul Edge Jr. requesting a rezone from I to A-1 for property located at 0 Westview Drive, LaFayette, Georgia 30728. Tax Parcel # 0-473-032. He asked if anyone was in attendance that would like to speak in opposition of this request. Hearing none, would anyone like to speak in favor of this request. Jennifer Tudor of Prime Realty came forward to explain that her brother is sick and

couldn't attend and Jeffery Edge is out of town. Ms. Tudor explained the family had asked for Agriculture and the concern of chicken houses was brought forward from the previous meeting. The family is more than willing to put into documentation to have no commercial chicken houses. These are five acre tracts and she wants to make sure everyone has clarification that there will be no commercial chicken houses on the property. Commissioner Whitfield thanked Ms. Tudor and asked if anyone else had any questions or comments. No one came forward so Commissioner Whitfield introduced Mr. Philip Cantrell, Chair of the Planning Commission. Mr. Cantrell stated there were several large pieces of property that could be sold and put together that would be large enough for commercial chicken houses. The realtor stated that it could be sold with restrictions to the deed that when selling this property it can't be combined and commercial chicken houses built. Mr. Cantrell stated the Planning Commission would not have a problem approving with these stipulations.

// Commissioner Whitfield reviewed a request from Jemima and Thomas Shirley requesting a rezone from R-1 to R-2 for property located at 0 Rogers Road, Rossville, Georgia 30741. Tax Map # 0-173-003. Commissioner Whitfield asked if anyone was present to speak in opposition of this request. Hearing none, he asked if there was anyone who would like to speak in favor of this request. Mr. Shirley stated he would be glad to answer any questions. **Minutes of the Scheduled Public Hearing**

**May 9, 2019**

**I. Call to order**

Commissioner Shannon Whitfield called to order the Public Hearing held at Walker County Courthouse Annex III, 201 S Main Street, LaFayette, Georgia at 6:06 PM on May 9, 2019.

**II. Attendees**

The following persons were present: Commissioner Shannon Whitfield, Legal & Policy Director Matt Williamson and Public Relations Director Joe Legge. Other guests signed in at the meeting as well, please see the attached sign in sheet.

**III. Open of Public Hearing:**

- I.* Commissioner Whitfield read the Agenda for Ordinance No. O-05-19, an Ordinance Amending Ordinance No. R-017-17 Creating a Special District for the Provision of Public Health Facilities and Services; To Amend The Date For Termination Of The Special District; and For Other Purposes. He asked Matt Williamson to read and explain this Ordinance. Mr. Williamson explained the reason is because the date differential of the real property versus manufactured housing. The intent is to make this special tax and special district only applicable for two years. In order to make that apply to both real property and prebuilt manufactured housing we had to distinguish those dates. Otherwise the real property owners would have paid twice but owners of prebuilt manufactured homes would not have paid twice. So therefore

that is the reason for the date differential. The Ordinance amends the original ordinance and creates a new sunset date for the original ordinance that corresponds to the date differential so this Public Health Facilities fee will end after two years rather than three years for all property owners in Walker County.

Commissioner Whitfield explained as with any Ordinance new or a change will be advertised in the County organ which is the Walker County Messenger & two Public Hearings as well. So even in a position to eliminate the fee we still have to go through the same legal process, public notice. He explained that what we have collected and expect to collect through the remainder of the year will give us the funding and allow us to sunset this in two years instead of three years. Simply put this has saved the tax payers one third of what we had originally thought. Also, when we did this in August 2017 we had not reached a settlement with Erlanger and potentially the order we received called for legal fees, court costs, interest back several years and possible financing. We estimated an additional two million dollars in cost. Fortunately we were able to negotiate a settlement with Erlanger where they forgave the back accrual of court costs, interest and attorney fees and also willing to finance for 36 months. All of this going forward interest free saved tax payers of Walker County an estimate of close to two million dollars. This was one reason we could reduce this sooner. We have made quarterly payments of \$650,000.00 all on time with positive cash flow. This is all restricted funds due to this being a special tax district only for use of Public Health Facilities. It's a great day in Walker County that we have been able to reach this goal in two years. Are there any questions, comments or concerns on this? No one had any comments or questions.

**ORDINANCE NO. O-05-19**

**AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. R-017-17 CREATING A SPECIAL DISTRICT FOR THE PROVISION OF PUBLIC HEALTH FACILITIES AND SERVICES; TO AMEND THE DATE FOR TERMINATION OF THE SPECIAL DISTRICT; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES**

**WHEREAS**, the Sole Commissioner of Walker County is the county governing authority for Walker County, Georgia (1939 Georgia Laws No. 39); and

**WHEREAS**, Article IX, Section 2, Paragraph 3(a)(3) of the Constitution of the State of Georgia authorizes county governing authorities to exercise powers and to provide for public health facilities and services; and

**WHEREAS**, Article IX, Section 2, Paragraph 6, of the Constitution of the State of Georgia authorizes county governing authorities to create special tax districts within the County for the provision of such services; and

**WHEREAS**, Ordinance No. R-017-17 created the Walker County Public Health Facilities and Services District comprising the entire area within the geographical boundaries of Walker County, Georgia and levied a special assessment against owners of each parcel of property within the district; and

**WHEREAS**, the dates for the special assessment relating to real property occurs prior to December 31 in each calendar year and the dates of assessment for pre-build manufactured housing occurs before April 1 each calendar year; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose for the establishment of the special district and special assessment has been achieved;

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COMMISSIONER AS FOLLOWS:**

The Walker County Public Health Facilities and Services District is terminated forthwith *nunc pro tunc* to December 31, 2018 for real property and to April 1, 2019 for pre-build manufactured housing. Accordingly, ORDINANCE NO. R-017-17 is hereby amended as follows:

**SECTION 5**

**TERMINATION OF SPECIAL DISTRICT**

5.1 This ordinance and the special district created shall terminate on December 31, ~~2019~~ **2018 as relating to real property and April 1, 2019 relating to pre-build manufactured housing**, and no additional fees shall accrue after that time. Such termination shall occur by the terms of this Ordinance, and no further action shall be required by the Sole Commissioner to effectuate such termination.

5.2 All fees, interest, and penalties that have accrued **under this ordinance**, ~~prior to December 31, 2019~~, as well as all efforts to enforce and collect, shall remain in full force and effect, and shall not otherwise be affected by the termination of the special district.

**RESOLUTION R-012-19**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE SOLE COMMISSIONER OF WALKER COUNTY  
TO APPOINT A LOCAL GOVERNMENT AGENT FOR PURPOSES OF THE  
GEORGIA MOBILE HOME ACT**

**WHEREAS**, the Georgia Abandoned Mobile Home Act (O.C.G.A. § 44-7-110 *et seq.*) provides local governing authorities with the authority to appoint an agent to determine the condition of mobile homes in order for landowners to remove or restore abandoned mobile homes left on their property and provides landowners with the guidance necessary to efficiently and properly identify and dispose of abandoned mobile homes in Georgia while protecting the rights of any owner, lienholder, or other interested parties by performing a due diligence search, notification, and hearing process; and

**WHEREAS**, O.C.G.A. § 44-7-112 (6) defines the “local government agent” as a person appointed by a local governing authority who is qualified to inspect an abandoned mobile home by demonstrating that he or she is qualified to determine if the abandoned mobile home is intact or derelict; and

**WHEREAS**, O.C.G.A. § 44-7-113 gives a local government agent, upon request by a landowner, authority to assess the condition of abandoned mobile homes, and provides that upon inspection, the local government agent shall classify such abandoned mobile home as either intact or derelict and provide documentation citing such determination to the requesting landowner,

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Sole Commissioner of Walker County, Georgia, that David Brown, the Director of Planning, Inspections and Zoning, is hereby appointed as the local government agent in Walker County for purposes of the Georgia Abandoned Mobile Home Act.
