I. CALL TO ORDER:

Chairman Phillip Cantrell called the meeting to order at 6:00 P.M.

II. READING & APPROVAL OF THE JULY 16TH, 2020 MEETING MINUTES:

Chairman Cantrell asked if there were any questions or changes to the minutes and if not was there a motion to approve. Susan Tankersley made a motion to approve. Terry Newberry seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous. Motion to approve carried.

III. NEW BUSINESS:

A. Rezone:

1. John Wesley & Carla Boldt: Mr. Boldt came forward and explained that he had a potential buyer for his property but they wanted to have some chickens and horses so they would like to rezone from R-1 to A-1 since the property did touch A-1. Several neighbors came forward and stated they did not mind some chickens and a couple of horses but they did not want any pigs. After some discussion Chairman Cantrell asked if there was a motion. Sam Bowman made a motion to approve. Moe Gass seconded the motion. Sam Bowman, Moe Gass and Sid Adams voted in favor of motion to approve. Terry Newberry, Scott McNabb and Michael Haney voted to deny. Jack Mullinax, Susan Tankersley, Daryl Brooks and Gerald Cook abstained. Motion to approve failed with lack of votes. Chairman Cantrell then asked if there was another motion. Michel Haney made a motion to table. Terry Newberry seconded to motion. Susan Tankersley and Jack Mullinax abstained and eight members voted in favor of tabling. Motion to table carried.

B. Variance:

- 1. Bill Otting Inc.: Mr. David Otting came forward and explained that they would like a variance from 60' to 40' from centerline of Cooper Road for a lot in Twelve Oaks Subdivision. Chairman Cantrell asked if there was a motion. Gerald Cook made a motion to approve. Michael Haney seconded the motion. Vote was unanimous to approve. Motion to approve carried.
- 2. Dustin Ryan: Mr. Dustin Ryan came forward and explained that he had bought the property on Chattanooga Valley Road and took the word of the seller that he would be able to build back the house that had burnt about a year and a half ago. After calling the Planning Office he said he found out that it had lost the grandfathered use. He said that he was planning on building that house for himself to live in and the others being rented out. Chairman Cantrell asked if there was a motion. Daryl Brooks made a motion to deny. Sid Adams seconded the motion. Moe Gass, Sid Adams, Daryl Brooks and Susan Tankersley voted in favor of the motion to deny. For lack of votes Chairman Cantrell asked if there was a second motion. Jack Mullinax made a motion to approve. Michael Haney seconded to motion. Scott McNabb, Gerald Cook, Jack Mullinax, Michael Haney, Sam Bowman and Terry Newberry voted in favor of motion to approve. Motion to approve carried.
- 3. Jimmy Maggard Jr.: Mr. Maggard came forward and said that he had purchased forty-eight acres and would like to divide himself and his two daughters off one acre each to build on and they all share the same drive. After some discussion on the required five acre rule on shared drives Chairman Cantrell asked if there was a motion. Jack Mullinax made a motion to deny. Terry Newberry seconded the motion. Nine members voted in favor to deny and Daryl Brooks abstained. Motion to deny carried.

IV. ADJOURNMENT:

Susan Tankersley made a motion to adjourn. Gerald Cook seconded the motion. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.

Rights advocates call for repeal of Georgia citizen's arrest law

ATLANTA - Georgia's citizen's arrest law has a history of racism and encourages civilians lacking law enforcement training to take the law into their own hands, civil- and human-rights advocates said Monday, July 13.

Law enforcement has resources to handle these kinds of things," Christopher Bruce, political di-rector for the Georgia chapter of the American Civil Liberties Union, told members of a leg-islative committee. "We should encourage citizens to look to law enforcement "

Non-Civil Committee took the
first step with Monday's hearing
(July 13) toward fulfilling House
Speaker David Ralston's pledge

to follow up on the Gener-al Assembly's recent pas-sage of a hate-crimes law by considering additional criminal justice reforms.

The state's citizen's arrest law became a focus of attention following the fatal shooting earlier this year of Ahmaud Arbery.

a 25-year-old black man gunned down while jogging near Brunswick. Two white men, a father and son, charged with mur-der in the case have claimed they were trying to make a citizen's arrest because they suspected Ar-bery had committed a burglary.

The law was put on the books in Georgia during the Civil War, a time when white slaveholders a time when white slaveholders were trying to prevent runaway slaves from joining the Union Army, said the Rev. James Wood-

"This law was liter-ally written to keep Negroes as slaves," he said.

After the war, vigi-lante mobs used the Bert Reeves David law to justify the lynching of blacks, Wood-

Both the ACLU and NAACP are recommending that the General Assembly repeal citizen's arrest as an outdated law that is no longer necessary in an era when law enforcement agencies have sufficient resources to handle

criminal complaints.

But some of the committee's Republican members questioned whether doing away with the citizen's arrest law would leave

Georgians unprotected from home invasions or shophome invasions or shop-keepers with no recourse to detain shoplifters. Rep. Bert Reeves, R-Mar-ietta, said a police officer can't always be present. "Can I detain somebody

"I'm personally not in favor of citizens arresting one another," Porter said. "They usually turn out badly with someone's mis-interpretation of the law." However, Porter urged law-makers to consider the poten-tial consequences of abolishing homeowners' ability to make a citizen's arrest during a home invasion, leaving them with only the legal protection of self-de-fense. the citizen's arrest law could be repealed while maintaining the tail consequences of abolishing ability of shopkeepers to detain shoplifting suspects. Homeowners would still be protected by the legal right to self-defense, she said.
